The priest speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

The Lenten season is a good opportunity for us all to spend time in prayer, to give to others in need and to 'fast' or 'give up' something as a commitment to becoming a better person.

COVID UPDATE

I have included a copy of the Western Australian Governments Level 2 Guidelines and Restrictions. Please note it is now mandatory for students in Year Three and above to wear face masks. If your child has a medical exemption correct verified proof must be supplied. I appreciate your support and understanding as we aim to keep St Lawrence safe, and our children's and community members wellness is always paramount in my decision making.

Level 2 public health measures
Effective 12.01am Thursday 3 March

Masks:
Mask-wearing required for adults and children in Years 3 and above at all indoor public settings and at major stadiums

Proof of vaccination:
Proof of vaccination requirements remain in place for a range of venues, businesses and events

Gatherings:
Home gatherings: 10 person limit
Weddings and funerals: 150 person limit and 2 square metre rule applies. No more than 10 people inside if held at a private residence.
Public outdoor events: 500 person limit with the 2 square metre rule and mask-wearing
Private outdoor events held in a public space: 50 person limit

Venues & businesses:
2 square metre rule and 150 person capacity limit for fitness venues, museums and galleries, places of worship. Venues such as beauty salons and hairdressers remain limited to 2 square metre rule.
Seated service only and 4 square metre rule for Crown Complex casino gaming floor
2 square metre rule and 150 person capacity limit with seated service only for nightclubs and hospitality venues

Community sport:
Indoors: no spectators except for parents or guardians, subject to venue requirements
Outdoors: no spectators except for parents or guardians

Entertainment venues and major stadiums:
50% capacity limit for entertainment venues such as theatres and cinemas, and for major stadiums

Health & care facilities:
Hospitals: no visitors, except for spouses, parents/carers, birth partners or for compassionate reasons
Aged and disability care: restricted to 2 visitors per resident per day

Higher education:
2 square metre rule and 150 person capacity limit for higher education facilities including TAFE, pathway colleges and English language schools

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday begins our forty-day season of Lent that leads to Easter. On Ash Wednesday, we come together like the people of the Old Testament to remind ourselves that we do not always follow God's ways and that we need to ask for God's mercy and forgiveness. Like God's people in the time of the prophets, we wear ashes to show that we want to turn away from whatever keeps us from God, and to have a change of heart, so that we can live in peace and in joy with God and with each other.

Today the teachers celebrated a Liturgy in their classrooms. Ashes blessed by Fr Emil were placed on each child's forehead by their teacher using a cotton bud, in line with Catholic Education directives.



NAPLAN Online 2022

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online in Term 2. Our Year 3 and 5 students will complete the NAPLAN Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy tests online, excluding the Year 3 Writing test which will be a paper test. To find out more information about NAPLAN Online, visit www.nap.edu.au.

NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. The data is also used to determine the effectiveness of our academic programs at the school. NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for. At St Lawrence we prepare students by embedding the skills and knowledge required for NAPLAN in our teaching and learning programs. Teachers will be working with students to ensure they are familiar with the test format, but it is important not to overstate the importance of the tests or to build up anxiety in the children. Our message will be "Just do your best."

An online demonstration site is available at www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site. This site allows students, parents/carers and teachers to familiarise themselves with the student test experience and functionality. Students will also gain familiarity with the different question types on the online NAPLAN tests.

Students will complete a NAPLAN practice test on Thursday 24 March. Please see below dates for all other NAPLAN tests. Due to current circumstances this information is subject to change. Parents will be informed if the school is made aware of any changes. Further information about NAPLAN will be sent home with children in Years 3 and 5 this week.

COVID UPDATE

Thank you to all families for responding so diligently with the restrictions that have been placed on schools by The Chief Health Officer. We are working to strict protocols for students who have been presenting with coughs, runny noses or high temperatures. The safety and wellbeing of all students and staff is our highest priority. As WA is now considered to be in a high caseload setting, we need to remain vigilant and monitor for symptoms. If your child is unwell, they should not attend school. VISOR SIGNS

Visor signs will be sent home with the eldest child of every family at the school today. The signs display each family's surname. Please attach the sign to your left-hand side visor so it is clearly visible to the staff on duty, blu-tack could be used to attach the sign. They will need to be displayed in your car when picking up children.
