


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# **Newsletter No. 8**

# **COVID-19 UPDATE**

#### ATTENDANCE

Thank you to all our parents who have used the online link on our school website to record positive and negative test results this week. A reminder that parents will need to continue to follow the usual processes if their child is absent from school.

- Parents will need to send an absentee note to their child's teacher and CC admin@stlawbal.wa.edu.au if their child has tested positive for COVID, has been deemed a close contact or is unwell.
- Parents will need to include in the email the reason their child was absent or going to be absent and the period of time.

#### UPDATED INFORMATION FOR CLOSE CONTACTS

A reminder that the isolation rules for close contacts has changed. If a child or adult is deemed a close contact of a household member who has tested positive for COVID they begin their isolation period in line with the first household member who tests positive.

If a subsequent member of the same household tests positive during their isolation period they **do not** need to start their quarantine period again.

Before a child can return to school, they would need to have a PCR on day 6 of isolation or a RAT on day 7 and the results of the test would need to be emailed to admin <u>admin@stlawbal.wa.edu.au</u>. and the child's teacher prior to the child returning to school on day 8 (if they tested negative and are asymptomatic).

Under the very high caseload settings, students at St Lawrence who are asymptomatic close contacts (**but not a household close contact**) will be able to continue attending:

- school and day care
- day care and before and after-school care (held on school grounds or at another place)
- other **school-based** sporting, cultural training, practice or events that are arranged by the school, occur directly before or after school, and are held on school grounds

These students must continue to quarantine at all other times that they are not attending the above until the 7 days has passed.

Thank you to all families for your continued effort in keeping up to date with the latest communication regarding COVID processes, cases and information. We understand that this information is abundant and can be overwhelming at times. We thank all parents for reading the updates and following the correct processes and procedures that have been introduced as a response to COVID-19, to keep our children and community members safe

Undoubtedly, the last few weeks at school have been very unusual with many of our children unable to attend school in a face-to-face capacity due to testing positive to Covid or, being a close contact of someone who is Covid positive. The heartening news from this situation is that community members are reporting a quick recovery from Covid. For that, we must be thankful. With just under three weeks left of term, it is vital that we all continue to play our part to ensure that we are minimising the effect of Covid.

We encourage all parents to use the online form for self-reporting positive and negative tests. Please see below an excerpt from last week's newsletter.

# New online form for Self-Reporting RAT and PCR results for Students and Staff

Catholic Education WA have recognised the extra burden being placed on schools and to assist in streamlining these processes have developed a self-reporting form for parents and staff members to record positive and negative test results and submit them to the school (RAT and PCR Tests). The information entered on the form will remain confidential.

Parents of children in Primary Schools need to complete and submit the form on behalf of their child.

Parents, caregivers at St Lawrence can now inform the school of their child's positive or negative COVID result/s by using the link on our school website located on the home page.

### SENSATIONAL SCIENCE

Our St Lawrence Scientists are inquisitive learners when it comes to Biological Science and all things Living, Non-Living and Once Living. How quickly this term has flown by! Where possible, we have made use of some of our school's outdoor spaces, including PP exploring how they use their Senses in the Orchard, whilst Year 3 had to "Escape the Orchard". Watch this space as Year 1 continue their quest as Palaeontologists, digging for Dinosaur fossils to better understand these giant animals that once walked the Earth.

Students in Year 4 and 6 have worked as superstar team members investigating Plant Growth. Year 4 teams looked at the best conditions for germination, and even have a broad bean growing because of their investigative work. They continue their journey of life cycles looking at Animals & Humans.

Year 2 had fun discussing how they have changed from Baby to Now and how they may change when they become Old!

Year 6 have wowed me with their team investigation skills from the effects of watering styles on a Tomato Plant growth, to Mouldy Bread. We round out the term with the questions – *what is mould? And can it be helpful, or only harmful?*

# **PHYSICAL EDUCATION -** With Mrs Major







Rainbows is a program which has been created to assist in providing a path towards healing for those dealing with a significant loss or life altering experience. The core of the program is centred on trust, acceptance and sharing.

It allows for those who are hurting to understand their feelings and to develop some tools required to move forward in helping to resolve their grief, loss or trauma.

Through Rainbows, children are helped to speak about their feelings, build a stronger sense of selfesteem and dispel their guilt and anger over the changes in their family. They no longer feel alone when they gather with other children who are facing the same or similar situations. Many experiences, which may occur in a child's life, can be overwhelming for them to be able to cope with and indeed enjoy their precious years of childhood. Separation or divorce between parents, the loss of a family member/close friend, a serious illness or accident, a parent working away, moving house/school/state/country or any other significant change can be a crushing event in a child's life. These situations can affect children socially, spiritually, behaviourally and academically.

The adults and the children are bound by confidentiality.

If you feel your child may benefit from a program such as Rainbows, we ask that you register your interest by emailing Mrs Louise Frenzel at <u>louise.frenzel@cewa.edu.au</u>. Upon registering your interest, the forms will be emailed directly to you. We ask that these authorities be completed and returned by Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March.

The program will start with some 'getting to know me' and art therapy sessions. It is anticipated the program will commence the first Friday of Term 2.

(Please be aware the program could be impacted by Covid-19 restrictions that may be imposed by the Government and the Health Department).
