The vision of St Lawrence Catholic Primary School, Balcatta is to share the message of God's love and friendship in a community of learners, developing the full potential of each child.

Birth of Mary

Mary was born to be the mother of the Savior of the world, the spiritual mother of all men, and the holiest of God's creatures. Because of her Son's infinite merits, she was conceived and born immaculate and full of grace. Through her, Queen of heaven and of earth, all grace is given to men.

On Our Lady's birthday the Church celebrates the first dawning of redemption with the appearance in the world of the Savior's mother, Mary. The Blessed Virgin occupies a unique place in the history of salvation, and she has the highest mission ever commended to any creature.



We rejoice that the Mother of God is our Mother, too. Let us often call upon the Blessed Virgin as "Cause of our joy", one of the most beautiful titles in her litany.

Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders

I'm often asked what one thing empowers great learning. It's a question with no one answer unfortunately. Many factors influence learning. Research supports that the number one influence on a child's success is not actually the school but the family. A child's family life is pivotal, this includes such factors as: the children's diets, hours of sleep children have, levels of physical activity, to name a few. A hungry child simply will not learn as well as a feed child, I tired child not as well as a rested child...it all makes sense.

Then there are the school factors, school resources, leadership focus, evidence-based learning approaches, teacher formation and professional development, pedagogical practices, parent involvement in the school, communications, all these and many more factors contribute to success at school.

As for what makes the master teacher, much of it comes down to relationships. How well does the teacher know the child, their likes and dislikes, their family life and history, their interests and motivations? The master teacher builds on all of these factors and empowers excellent learning opportunities.

Our teachers at St Lawrence are exceptional practitioners, they are highly qualified, continuously update their professional practice and most importantly are enthusiastic and dedicated to our children. I have worked in many schools over my career, large double stream schools, single stream schools, remote schools, and inner-city schools. Never have I had the privilege of working with such an outstanding staff. We are blessed to have such a high-quality team delivering an outstanding education opportunity for our children. I thank them all and ask God to bless and protect them always.

Catholic Schools of Excellence

A reminder that all Catholic Schools operate under a Code of Conduct. The document can be accessed using the QR Codes located strategically around the school.

Purpose

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to describe minimum standards of conduct in all behaviour and decision making to ensure the safety and well-being of students.

Application

The Code applies to staff, students, volunteers, parents and guardians as applicable. The term 'parents' includes guardians.

Introduction

You acknowledge the inherent vulnerability of the students in your care.

You recognise that the safety and well-being of students depends upon your vigilance and diligence and the vigilance and diligence of all adults.

The Code does not give you detailed professional advice on specific behaviour. Rather, it describes the minimum requirements expected of you.

The Guidelines are illustrative and not an exhaustive list of the behaviours covered by the Code.

If your behaviour varies from the standards described in this Code and Guidelines, you should be prepared to explain and justify your decisions and actions.

While mandatory language such as 'must', 'shall' and 'will' is not used throughout the Code, there is a presumption the conduct described is mandatory and therefore not discretionary.

The Principal expects you to conduct yourself personally and professionally in a way that maintains public trust and confidence in your school and the Church.

You have a responsibility to students and their family, other members of the school community and the wider community to provide and support safe and competent education and care of students.

You will do your best to support other members of the school community to comply with the Code.

In cases of conflict between parts of the Code, between the Code and other school policies, or in any decision making choices, you give priority to the outcome that will be in the best interests of the safety and well-being of the child.

Conduct Statements

- 1. You act safely and competently.
- 2. You give priority to students' safety and well-being in all your behaviour and decision making.
- 3. You act in accordance with the values of the Gospel as defined in the Code of Ethical Conduct.
- 4. You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.
- 5. You respect the dignity, culture, values and beliefs of each member of the school community.
- 6. You treat personal information about members of the school community as private and confidential.
- 7. You give impartial, honest and accurate information about the education, safety and well-being of students.
- 8. You support all members of the school community in making informed decisions about students.
- 9. You promote and preserve the trust and privilege inherent in your relationship with all members of the school community.
- 10. You maintain and build on the community's trust and confidence in Catholic schools and the Church.
- 11. You act reflectively and ethically.
- 12. You allow students to have a voice in their education, safety and well-being.


NAPLAN

All students who participated in the NAPLAN tests will receive an individual report of their results next week. NAPLAN individual student reports provide information about what students know and have achieved in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. The reports also provide information on how students have performed against the national average (over one million students participate in NAPLAN tests each year) and the national minimum standards.
