The vision of St Lawrence Catholic Primary School, Balcatta is to share the message of God's love and friendship in a community of learners, developing the full potential of each child.



Our culture is sometimes very centred on belongings, on the material matters of this world, on acquiring and accumulating. Jesus certainly dispels the myths that society says will bring happiness.

The general attitude of society is that being wealthy will solve every problem and that if every problem is solved, we will be happy. Just listen to a conversation in the average lunchroom of a workplace: "How are you today?" "I'll be great if I win gold lotto." "Is everything ok? You look troubled." "Nothing that a million dollars wouldn't fix!"

Jesus dispels this thinking and says,

"A person's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."

Luke 12:13-21.

Then one from the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." But He said to him, "Man, who made Me a judge or an arbitrator over you?" And He said to them, "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses." Then He spoke a parable to them, saying: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' So, he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry."' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then those will those things which you have provided?'

"So is he who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."

The man in this story felt that material possessions equalled peace and happiness. He felt that he had 'arrived'. The problem was that his focus on wealth and possessions had blinded him to eternal and spiritual realities. Jesus also said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." His heart was in the things he had accumulated, his earthly treasures.

### **Inspiring Christ-Centre Leaders**

Our Student Leadership model is well under way for the 2022 School Leaders. I am aware that many parents have varied thoughts regarding School Leaders. Some schools have removed school leaders' models altogether and others have place significant importance on the model they employ and work through a myriad of processes. For me and to be clear and transparent, student leadership is important for students, it provides experience and leadership opportunities during students schooling years, they help students to learn the art of building relationships within teams, defining identities, and achieving tasks effectively. They also provide an opportunity to learn to identify and display effective communication and interpersonal skills.

Leadership is a skill for life, and we endeavour to provide all students with regular opportunities to be involved and strengthen their skills. Being involved in the process also provides opportunities to build reliance, which research identifies as lacking in many of our nation's younger generations. We know that in our youth we learn how to cope with failure, with not achieving our goals, with coming second. These building blocks and life skills must be strengthened and enhanced in our youth, if not we are not setting ourselves up for success as we navigate the many ups and downs of life.

Our boys and girls are busy preparing for their speeches and the election process. I include the following information taken from the Student Leadership Policy.

#### **The Election Process:**

- Each applicant must make a 2-minute maximum speech in the school hall to the Years 4 and 5 students and class teachers, Education Assistants and the Leadership Team.
- A bell will sound 30 seconds before concluding your speech.
- All speeches must be concluded within the 2-minute timeframe.
- The speech schedule will be as follows:

Day One – Faith Leaders Day Two – Environmental Leaders Day Three – Student Leaders Day Four – Sport Leaders

- The new leaders will be announced at the End of the School Year.
- At the first mass of the following year the leadership badges will be blessed and presented to the leaders.

#### **Conditions of Applying:**

- The maximum number of leadership roles any student can apply for is <u>two</u>.
- A student can only be appointed <u>one</u> leadership role.
- SEQTA data and records will also be considered when judging the suitability of a candidate. (These may be bound by privacy and confidentiality laws.)
- **The Principal** will have the final say and the right to appoint all school leaders in accordance with his or her mandate as Principal.
- If leaders lose their badge the cost of the replacement badge will be at their own cost.

### **Catholic Pastoral Communities**

Here at St Lawrence Primary School, we provide many wonderful occasions for our children to continue to come to know our Lord. Our Religious Education program includes many opportunities for children to strengthen their understandings of God and to ponder life's questions. Often formed in the mode of "wonder questions", where children are encouraged to ask questions and articulate their own wonderings about God. All our Gatherings, Assemblies, Masses and Prayers also lead our children to come closer to God. Visits by Father Emil and Father Adam offer the children that deeper connection to God. As we develop a personal relationship with God, we are able to become more attuned to the working of the Lord in our own lives.

It is my personal long held belief that children are in fact masterful theologians, if we follow the definitions below of theology:

**Theology** (from Greek  $\Theta \varepsilon \delta \zeta$  meaning "god" and  $\lambda \circ \gamma i \alpha$ , *-logy*, meaning "study of") is the systematic and rational study of concepts of deity and of the nature of religious truths, or the learned profession acquired by completing specialised training in religious studies.

Augustine of Hippo defined the Latin equivalent, *theologia*, as "reasoning or discussion concerning the Deity"; Richard Hooker defined "theology" in English as "the science of things divine"

When our children are talking about God, wondering in awe about God, articulating in their own words their understandings of the Divine. Then to my mind of thinking our children are in fact being theologians. It is the most special thing for me to listen to our little children tell me about God. You would be surprised what I have learnt from our students over the 35 plus years I have been employed in Catholic Education. I have been told firmly and clear exactly where He resides and how he is thinking and feeling. I was in our Three-Year-Old Kindy once when one of our children told me, and I quote. "God sits on my shoulder." Now I ask you, how precious is that inspired line of thinking.

### Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable

A reminder that schools generally only archive certain mandate legal documents on students. These are generally held only until a child has turned 21 and then destroyed. Such documents are held in case a school is subpoenaed to provide data on children for a court case or the like. Archived data includes but is not limited to attendance records, absentee notes if collected, psychological reports, teacher/school staff observations if concerns have been raised, etc.

## **Home Learning Tip**

During reading sessions these are the types of questions your child might be asked at school. You can include some of these questions when you talk about reading at home too.

The following questions require your child to get clues from the text to answer:

- 1. How do you think the character was feeling?
- 2. How would you change the ending?
- 3. How would you describe the changes in the character/setting?

These questions require your child to refer back to the text:

- 4. What were the characters' names?
- 5. What was the setting?
- 6. What did each character do?
- 7. What happened at the beginning, middle and end of the text?

The following questions require your child to think about the main messages:

- 8. What do you think is the main message in the story or text?
- 9. Can you relate it to another event or issue?
- 10. Do you agree with the views of the author?
- 11. What is your opinion about the message in the story?
- 12. How could other people see it differently?

#### MEETINGS

Day One –Faith Leaders Day Two – Environmental Leaders Day Three – Student Leaders Day Four – Sport Leaders

The new leaders will be announced at the Whole School Nativity.

At the first mass of the following year the leadership badges will be blessed and presented to the leaders.

After receiving the badges, the student leaders will recite a Leadership Pledge.

#### THE VOTING PROCESS

Voting will commence in Term 4.

Year 3, 4 and 5 students and class teachers, Education Assistants and the Leadership Team will have the opportunity to vote.

The Principal will have the final say.

A digital voting slip will be created using Google Forms for each Leadership Role.

An email will need to be sent to the co-ordinators with the list of candidates for each role.

A link will be created and send to the year 3, 4 and 5 class teachers and the Leadership team.

It is a requirement that the year 3, 4 and 5 class teachers post this onto Teams so students can access the link. Students and staff will click on the link, tick the boxes of three candidates they would like to vote for, and press submit.

The responses will be calculated by Google Forms and submitted to the Leadership team.

#### **CONDITIONS OF APPLYING**

The maximum number of leadership roles you can apply for is two.

You can only be appointed one leadership role.

SEQTA data and records will also be considered.

The Principal will have the final say and the right to appoint all school leaders.

If leaders lose their badge the cost of the replacement badge will be at their own cost.

#### YEAR TWO


The Year Two children have been extremely busy in the classroom as well as swimming every afternoon and practicing their Assembly item for this **Friday 5 November.**
