Background

St Lawrence Primary School in Balcatta is a Catholic co-educational Primary School catering for approximately 250 children. The ages and classes span from Three Year Old Pre-Kindy, Four Year Old Kindy and the compulsory years of Pre Primary to Year Six.

The school was originally established by the Sisters of Mercy in 1960 and still maintains a close connection to the Sisters and the Mercy Charism. Our school serves the Parish communities of Balcatta - Gwelup. Spirituality is developed in many ways here at St Lawrence. Our Religious Education curriculum, Masses and Liturgies throughout the school year and the Making Jesus Real (MJR) program all come together to help us build and enhance our spirituality. We join with the Parish to run the Sacramental Program and this incorporates workshops, information nights and retreats. We have daily prayer to help our students to come closer to God and learn how to give thanks and seek intercessions. The Parish and School are currently served by the Salvatorian Fathers.

St Lawrence is our Patron Saint and our School and Parish are proudly named after this great saint. St Lawrence was born in 225 and was martyred in 258. He is one of the most venerated Saints in the Roman calendar and much loved for his compassion and dedication to the poor. We seek his protection and guidance in our daily lives.

St Lawrence has a long history of being a successful school. The school is highly regarded in the local community and has generally maintained pleasing academic outcomes over the years. The school is well resourced and offers a rich and varied curriculum. School buildings and resources are of a very high standard.
